100/25 Welcome from the Chair: Chairman R. Overton welcomed everyone to the meeting.

103/25 Public Session: 15 minutes is allowed for members of the public to raise their concerns. There were seven members of the public present.

The following matters were discussed: Christmas Lights within the Parish, progress at the Gower, the planning application for Greenways Farm / Land alongside the old A5 and appreciation for Cllrs who went to speak against this at the TWC planning meeting, and the Workers Memorial site.

105/25 Clerk's update on any matters arising from the previous meeting:

The Clerk issued an update on Christmas events, coach trips, memorial unveiling, NEO Walkabouts, and recent storms and water shortage. The request for further information relating to the 4 all Foundation Grant had resulted with a request for the grant to be spent on clubs within schools of the parish, or a summer holiday activity. The Clerk was continuing to work on the CiLCA portfolio alongside working to bring the policy folder up to date, and we would now carry out the bank reconciliation with the quarterly finance review. The issues raised during public session in November had now been escalated to the relevant parties.

Comment - Object

St Georges and Priorslee Parish Council notes a number of positive changes in the proposed plan such as the reduction in density, removal of the apartment block and the increase in green space, including the addition of the green corridors. It does, however, remain opposed to any development on this site. Reasons have already been provided in previous comments and at Telford and Wrekin's October planning meeting where this development was discussed.

The Telford and Wrekin borough council's local plan provides a framework for new development in the borough until 2031. The proposed development on this site is not required to meet that local plan and should therefore be rejected. The proposed development is purely speculative, aiming to make a profit for the developers and landowners at the expense of the local community.

Infrastructure in the area is already stretched to breaking point and S106 funding would not be sufficient to address the current shortfall in GP and dentist provision, let alone bring it to a position where it could cope with the additional demands that these additional homes would bring.

Similarly, whilst the developer commissioned traffic reports tell a different story, the roads in the area are extremely busy at peak times. The additional load during construction and afterwards would not be in anyway beneficial to local residents. The proposed signal-controlled junction with the A5 will negatively impact traffic flow in the area and is likely to increase traffic loads on other roads when drivers avoid the tailbacks it will cause around Limekiln roundabout.

Finally, there has been no "spades in the earth" archaeological assessment. This should be carried out if development is eventually approved.

We hope that the planning committee will heed the ongoing objection of the Parish Council, local borough councillors and most importantly, the objections of many hundreds of local residents who have taken the time to comment on this application.

(a)Update on project: It was reported that the south-wing roof had now been completed, however the north-wing had suffered in the recent storm. It is hoped that the felting for the north-wing will be completed by Christmas, possibly the tiles too. The houses have had kitchens installed and are on their final fit for electrics. Overall, everything is going well, and thanks were given to issues raised these will be taken up with TWC & the Contractors.

110/25 Christmas Lights:

- (a) Update from the working group: Lightwire installed the remaining Christmas lights last week. Delays were due to bad weather & outstanding infrastructure from TWC contractors. Tree at Lakeside Plant Centre required a replacement transformer which is now working, due to storm damage, a large amount of lights on the tree in St Georges Square were damaged and remain off. Column 561 Gower Street has now received a replacement timer. Column 1094 Snedshill Way has a nest blocking the access point so unable to connect the unit. Column 524 Gatcombe Way has had commando units fitted by TWC contractors however there is still no power supply this has been chased with TWC.
